All recyclable items should be **empty, rinsed and clean**.
Keep recyclables loose - do **not** box, bag or bundle.

PAPER

- Cardboard & boxboard
- Food & beverage cartons
- Magazines & newspapers
- Office paper, envelopes & junk mail
- Pizza boxes (no liner, no food residue)

- Gift wrap & gift bags
- Ice cream containers
- Paper cups (hot & cold)
- Paper towels, napkins, tissues
- Shredded paper
- Tissue paper
- Paper take out food containers

PLASTIC

- Plastic bottles (with or without caps attached)
- Plastic containers, tubs & lids
- Plastic one-use cups (no lids, no straws)

- Cup lids
- Food wrappers
- Loose bottle caps
- Plastic bags & wrap
- Plastic plates, bowls & utensils
- Single-use coffee pods
- Straws
- Styrofoam
- Water filters
- Deodorant packaging
- Items under 2" x 2"

GLASS

- Beverage bottles & jars
- Food bottles & jars

- Ceramic mugs & plates
- Mirrors & window glass
- Pyrex, drinking glasses, vases

METAL

- Aerosol cans (food-grade only)
- Aluminum foil
- Cans & bottles
- Foil containers
- Metal lids from cans & bottles

- Aerosol cans (cleaners, (deodorizers, pesticides etc.)
- Paint cans
- Pots & Pans*
- Small pieces of scrap metal*
- Spiral wound containers
- Metal hangers*

*Put in scrap metal bin

Food scraps can be dropped off at the Transfer Station in the brown food scrap bins.
